The Bretz Floods and Formation of the Gorge — Fascinating Topic for November Meeting

We are very fortunate to have John Snively as the speaker for the November Program/Meeting. Many members have requested this topic and we will have the opportunity to learn about the famous floods that formed the Columbia River Gorge.

John Snively grew up in the Willamette Valley where he earned his Bachelor and Master degree from Portland State University. In 1975, after earning his degree in biology, he began teaching science at Clackamas Community College. Shortly after beginning his teaching career, John returned to the classroom as a student and received a degree in the geological sciences. The combination of geology and biology worked well for John and he developed several field-based natural history courses to teach students about the biology, botony, and geology of unique regions such as Death Valley, Malheur Wildlife Refuge and the Oregon coast. He established an Endowment at CCC to help students handle the financial burden involved in attending science field courses and was honored as "Teacher of the Year" at CCC in 1997 and again in 2000. John retired from full time teaching in 2004 but is still very active in working to help people of all ages appreciate the natural world.





The exhibits at the center were well done and informative. We all enjoyed the narrative along our route provided by Sharon Nesbit, pointing out features and sharing historic stories and lore.

The next stop was the Heritage Station museum in Pendleton, which has been recently remodeled. The current exhibit focuses on communication and artifacts depicting the changes over the years. The one room school house is a building complete with blackboard, dunce cap, teacher's desk, "paddle", wood stove and student desks, etc. One can't help but reminisce about old school days when standing in that room.

TraveLodge in downtown Pendleton was the destination for the evening and the proprietors took good care of our group and checked us into our rooms very efficiently. Trekkers broke up into a couple of groups to dine....with the largest group going to the "Rainbow Cafe" cowboy bar for dinner.
